Report summary of events:

1. *Report on Workshop on Academic Publishing: Understanding the Nuances and Techniques*

The Research and Publication Committee, in collaboration with IQAC, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi, organized a workshop on "Academic Publishing: Understanding the Nuances and Techniques" on 6th December 2023 at 1:15 PM in the Old Seminar Room. The session aimed to provide faculty and students with insights into the academic publishing process and best practices for scholarly communication.

The workshop featured Robinson Raju, Commissioning Editor at Cambridge University Press and Assessment, as the resource person. With over 12 years of experience in academic books and journals publishing, he has previously worked with Routledge and Sahapedia. His expertise spans editorial strategy, manuscript development, and publishing ethics. He has also delivered presentations at leading institutions including JNU, University of Hyderabad, Tezpur University, Jamia Millia Islamia, the Indian Institute of Science, IISER Mohali, and BITS.

During the session, Robinson Raju discussed key aspects of academic publishing, including manuscript preparation, peer review processes, journal selection, and ethical considerations. He offered practical guidance on navigating editorial expectations, avoiding common pitfalls, and enhancing the visibility and impact of research. The discussion also covered the evolving landscape of academic publishing, including open access and digital dissemination.

The workshop was well-received by participants, who gained clarity on how to approach publishing their research effectively. It reinforced Kamala Nehru College's commitment to fostering research aptitude

and supporting faculty and students in contributing to scholarly discourse with rigor and integrity.

2. Workshop on plagiarism prevention using Turnitin (Online)

This online workshop on plagiarism was conducted for the faculty of Kamala Nehru College to understand the use and application of the Turnitin for using it for their research work. The workshop was conducted by Dr. Shipra Awasthi at Kamala Nehru College in 2026. Dr. Shipra Awasthi, is an expert in plagiarism and academic misconduct who is associated with the Jawaharlal Nehru University Central Library. She frequently contributes to research on plagiarism, academic integrity, and text-matching softwares.
