EVENT REPORTS

This year, the society remained highly active and carried out several important initiatives across these clusters. These included the **celebration of Independence Day** with a flag-hoisting ceremony **strategic reorganization of teams** to assign dedicated student groups to each of the five villages, **an induction session** for a new batch of 56 volunteers, a **national painting activity at Kartavya Path**, a large-scale **medical camp in Humayunpur Village**, a social advocacy **street play in Pijanji**, and a **speaker session** highlighting the historical importance of Delhi's villages.

1. Independence Day Celebration

On August 15, 2025, at 9:30 a.m., the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan of Kamla Nehru College, University of Delhi, celebrated the Independence Day at Jaat Chaupal, Humayunpur Village. The event was centered around the theme, "Let's honor our past and work together for the future."



The celebration featured a flag hoisting ceremony and cultural talks that highlighted India's journey towards independence and its vision for the future. Faculty members including Dr. Trishala Chauhan, Dr. Padma Dolkar, Dr. Gitika Yadav, Dr. Atithi Pant, and Society Convener Dr. Green Awasthi attended the event, alongside the students and community members, underscoring the collaborative spirit of the occasion.

2. UBA Strategy and Planning Meeting

The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Society convened a strategy and planning meeting on September 9, 2025, in the second-floor staffroom. The session was attended by faculty members Dr. Green Awasthi, Dr. Gitika Yadav, and Dr. Trishala Chauhan, along with core team members Shalini, Palak, and Preeti.

During the meeting, it was decided that newly recruited students would be divided into five teams, with each team assigned one of the five adopted villages: Humayunpur, Hudco Place Slum, Zamrudpur, Pilanji, and Gautam Nagar to carry out activities. To ensure smooth and efficient functioning, every village team was allotted members for specific roles such as Coordinator, Social Media Management, Logistics, Photography, and Reporting. The meeting also finalized the upcoming induction programme for volunteers and set tentative dates for organizing a medical camp.

3. Induction Session

The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Society organized its induction session on September 17, 2025, from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m., to welcome 56 new members and introduce them to the vision and activities of the society. The session began with a presentation led by President Shalini and Vice President Palak Chauhan, who provided a detailed overview of the structure and significance of UBA.

Other core members shared the history of the society and highlighted key moments from a previous orientation session with Mr. P.K. Singh. The programme concluded with an interactive segment where students expressed their views on village empowerment and had their questions addressed. The event proved highly motivating and successfully encouraged new members to participate actively in the society's upcoming initiatives.



4. Kartavya Path Event: "Viksit Bharat ke Rang"

On September 19, 2025, the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Society participated in a national painting activity at Kartavya Path titled "Viksit Bharat ke Rang, Kala ke Sang: Ek Vishva Record Banaane ki Oar." a total of 24 students from the UBA team actively took part in the event, departing from the college by bus at 10:00 a.m. Upon arrival, the college was allotted Block D, 74 and 75, where students began their work with enthusiasm and creativity.



The faculty members present included the Society Convenor Dr. Green Awasthi and Dr. Padma Dolker, supported by the Student Council members Shalini, Palak Chauhan, and Ngayir Gamlin. The activity concluded at 12:30 p.m. and the team returned to college by 1:15 p.m. after contributing to the national world-record attempt.

5. Medical Check-up Camp at Humayunpur Village

On September 24, 2025, the UBA Society, in collaboration with Lions Club Delhi Capital and Delhi Lions Eye Centre, organized a free medical check-up camp at Jaat Chaupal, Humayunpur Village. The camp ran from 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and offered services such as BP and sugar tests, dental and eye check-ups, and general physician consultations.

The event was very well-received by the community, recording 118 registrations from participants ranging in age from their twenties to nineties. The active involvement of 18 students and faculty members including Society Convenor Dr. Green Awasthi, Dr. Padma Dolker, Dr. Gitika Yadav, Dr. Trishala Chauhan, Dr. Atithi Pant, and Mr. Inderjeet, contributed to its success. The camp demonstrated the strength of collective effort in promoting community health and providing essential services to residents.

On April 22, 2026, the UBA Society hosted a speaker session titled “Delhi Beyond Empires: Understanding the City Through its Villages” at Kamala Nehru College. The event was graced by Chief Guest Dr. Shekhar Tokas from Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University and witnessed the participation of 39 students and faculty members.

Dr. Tokas delivered an extensive lecture on the historical significance of Delhi’s villages and their role in shaping the city’s urban fabric beyond imperial narratives. The talk explored the tension between tradition and modernity and was followed by a Q&A session on themes of urbanization and heritage conservation. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Green Awasthi, broadening students’ understanding of Delhi’s layered history and the relevance of village systems in modern governance.
